LEGAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

Denison Mines (USA) Corporation
La Sal Mines Complex
Plan of Operations Amendment

USDA Forest Service
Manti-La Sal National Forest

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the U.S. Forest Service (FS) are conducting an Environmental Assessment (EA) of proposed activities associated with uranium mining near La Sal, Utah. Denison Mines (USA) Corporation (the Proponent) has submitted a Plan of Operations Amendment (POA) amendment for their existing operations. This amendment would provide for additional disturbance of BLM and Forest System land, and combine several existing Plans of Operations into one document.

The Manti-La Sal National Forest, Moab/Monticello Ranger District is proposing to allow the Proponent to conduct operations on Forest Service lands as proposed in the POA. In addition to combining all existing operations and facilities into one Plan of Operations, this proposal includes installing up to 14 vents with associated access roads (< =14 acres of disturbance) and disturbing up to 34 acres in association with exploratory drilling and access roads for the proposed 20 years of operations. The operations will be located on the south side of Pine Ridge approximately 3 miles east of La Sal.

Although the BLM and FS are jointly conducting the EA (BLM is the lead agency), each agency will make a Decision with respect to its lands only. If you already commented on this project during the initial scoping period ending January 31, 2011, please do so again if you wish to have appeal eligibility on the Forest Service's Decision.

The public is invited to comment on our proposed action. This decision is subject to appeal pursuant to Forest Service regulations 36 CFR 215 and 251. Those who submit timely comments during this comment period will be accepted as potential appellants. Comments can be either oral or written in response to this project. Each individual or representative from each organization, submitting comments must either sign the comments or otherwise verify identity in order to attain appeal eligibility. Comments received, including names and addresses of those who comment, will be considered part of the public record for this project and will be available for public inspection. Comments should include the information required pursuant to 36 CFR 215.6(a)(3), as published in the Federal Register on June 4, 2003.
